


I. About Zacatecas City

It has a privileged location in north-central Mexico, connected both by land and by air with important cities in Mexico and the United States. Since its establishment as a mining camp in the 16th century, Zacatecas has long been valued for its rich deposits of silver and other minerals, in fact it still ranks number one in silver production in the country. It is a place full of history and is notable for its harmonious design and Baroque profusion of its façades, where decorative elements have magnificently carved in pink stone. Zacatecas is a magical land of legends, where you can be amazed by a fantastic selection of museums or you can appreciate some of this land's most rugged and stunning natural scenery, everything under intensely blue skies. This destination offers



rich cultural heritage, architectural wonders, unforgettable adventure experiences, wide array of activities, festivals, romance, food and much more.



Be dazzled by beautiful Colonial Architecture, alleys with numerous legends, bars and restaurants full of tradition and much more. There are biking tours and Trolley Sightseeing — including night tours-, or you can walk on your own and explore the most beautiful corners of the Centre of Zacatecas.

Tourists Visa.

II. Conference Venue



The proposed venue for GUADEC 2020 is the Science, Technology and Innovation Council of Zacatecas; it is an enclosure that is part of the architectural complex of Cozcyt, created essentially to carry out academic, cultural and institutional events related to science, technology and innovation; in this complex is located the Free Software Laboratory that has been consolidated as a highly specialized instance in the development of technological projects, taking advantage exclusively of FOSS technologies, involving young university students who, with the aim of catalyzing their talent and skills, enrolled them in real projects.



The center of communication and dissemination of science of the Zacatecan Council of Technology Science, Innovation is a fairly versatile complex given the architectural design that allows to have 4 rooms of up to 50 people as transform it into a room of up to 200 comfortably people seated including tables of work.

Similarly, the Free Software Laboratory has 3 rooms with a capacity of up to 20 people

and can become one that houses up to 70 people without problem; complemented by a computer center with 20 desktop workstations with high processing capacity.



Its facilities have adequate areas for communication and dissemination of the CTI, such as:



Auditorium: Capacity for 190 people, three spaces for people with different capacities.



Free Software Laboratory: Three classrooms with capacity for 20 attendees each.





Aula Magna: Capacity for 200 people.

Multi-purpose classrooms: Four classrooms with a capacity for up to 40 people.

Executive classrooms: Two classrooms with capacity for 20 people.


Computer Room: With 20 desktop equipment available.

III. Logistic and Dates

IV. Cultural and Social Events

Museums

Zacatecas has a wide variety of museums where in each of them shows the cultural diversity that the place has. Among the most outstanding museums are the Manuel Felguérez Museum, Pedro Coronel Museum, Rafael Coronel Museum, Guadalupe's Museum, University Museum of Sciences among others. In each of these museums the History of Zacatecas and Mexico in general is denoted.



Historic tour

One of the main tourist attractions that Zacatecas has is the tour of the historic center, in this one, the history of the place of different points of view is explained. On this same tour is made a visit to the Eden Mine considered the most important mine in the Area at the time of the Spanish conquest, which today only functions as a tourist attraction. Underground bar!

In Zacatecas there is the only bar in the world located several meters below the earth, it is located within the best known mine of the State, the Eden mine. It offers an extensive cocktail service and has a dance floor to enjoy a pleasant evening moment.

Callejoneada

Zacatecas stands out for the joy with which the festivities are lived, a clear example of this are the traditional alleys that are held in the main alleys of the city center. A "callejoneada" is a walk of a group of people where the typical music of the region is present, in this case the drumming. at the front of the alley is a donkey that carries two pitchers with the typical drink of the state either pulgue or mezcal.



Archeological zone "La Quemada"



Airplane:

Zacatecas International airport "General Leobardo C. Ruiz" IATA code: ZCL, is well connected and have daily domestic and international flights,



Bus:

Zacatecas International bus station, have daily travels from/to Zacatecas to all the states in México and several USA states including Texas, California, among others, tickets range from 5 usd up to 150 USD depending on the destination.

Local

Public transportation:



++Zacatecas, City is well connected by public transportation including: Bus and Taxi, typically, bus stops are within 200 mts apart covering the entire city, the current bus ticket price is 0.5 usd /person, buses run approximately 15 min apart, and taxis may vary from 1.5 usd to 8 usd for a full end to end city trip. Zacatecas also have the major app-based players including Uber and Cabify.

Accomodations:

There are several accommodation options in the city, which are mostly concentrated in the city centre near the venue, we recommend spreading attendees over a number of accommodation options. The high availability and price options will make sure that everyone can find an accommodation option that will satisfy their personal taste and budget. Zacatecas have some world wide unique hotels, such as the Quinta Real Hotel, this 5* hotel was built over a bullring, other espectacular Hotel is the Baruk Teleferico,

this 5* hotel have a cable railway to see the city from above. The cheapest options would start from approximately 10USD for a dormitory bed in a hostel. For a stay in a 4* hotel, the price of a double room is typically around 25-35 to USD per night. 5* hotels can cost up to 150USD per night for a double room. And other option is appbase apartments such as AirBnB with prices ranging from 10 USD night up to 100 USD for a full house /night. The list of hotels will be announced at the future website. The COZCYT will provide a list of hotels with preferential rates.





VI. General and Typical Food

Thanks to its geographical location and the important role that Zacatecas played in the historical development of Mexico, Zacatecas welcomed a great cultural diversity, because of this, Zacatecas has been the cradle of many traditions, typical dishes, drinks and dances.


The typical cuisine of Zacatecas has a variety of dishes, among which stand out, the "Asado de bodas", "enchiladas", "mole", "tostadas ", "tacos"", there are different types pozoles, but there is a special type made with purple corn, there are a big amount of broths, two of them are vegetable broth with chipotle and beef broth.




Option for breakfast includes "gorditas" that are biscuit-like packages of cooked cornmeal, stuffed with different dishes and flavors, the most common and traditional place to try them, it is called "Gorditas Doña Julia". An other option is "menudo", that is a spiced, reed, broth, made with beef.

Later on, in the afternoon, for the lunch time and dinner, if you really want to try the real flavor of Zacatecas, the perfect option is the "Asado de bodas" that is the most typical and representative dish of Zacatecas, which consists of pork leg marinated with dried chillies and aromatic spices served with rice and









Zacatecas also has a wide variety of traditional drinks such as pulque, mezcal, craft beer and wine, it should be noted that in Zacatecas there is an important wine company called "Tierra Adentro", an internationally known wine brand.



The average amount of money needed for a good meal, range from **\$5 USD** (\$100 MXN) to **\$10 USD** (\$200 MXN).

Zacatecas is well known for its large range of sweets and typical desserts, in the typical sweets has the "alfajores", "guayabates", "mechonas", etc., and for desserts you have the snow of garrafa, sweet potato boiled with guava syrup, membrillo ate.

Zacatecas has a huge amount of restaurants and food stalls, if you go to the downtown is for sure that you are going to find something delicious to eat. But, because of the zacatecan food is prepared with a variety of condiments and meat, the event will have a special menu that it is going to include vegan food, vegetarian food, gluten free food, etc.

VII. Tourism and Tourist Attractions

15 UNIQUE EXPERIENCES YOU CAN ONLY LIVE IN ZACATECAS

1. Become a Silversmith for the Day In the Silversmith Center of Zacatecas you can understand the mechanics of how jewelry is made, and if you want, you can create a beautiful piece with your own hands.



- 2. Ancient Site for Stargazing Access to the magical site of La Quemada at
- sunset. With no light pollution you can just laid down on the grass and admire an oceanstars; telescopes are also available to visitors to provide an even more memorable stargazing. A good way to end up this experience is enjoying the delicious flavors available only that region!
- 3. El Cerro de la Bufa, history and adventure The views from the top are superb and there are a number of other attractions: an interesting group of monuments, a mausoleum, a chapel, an observatory, and a museum. It is also the site of a zip-line, and a teleférco (cable car). You can take a ride aboard the 30-30 panoramic train, or ride an ATV up the hill.





- 4. Callejoneada Zacatecana (alleyway parties) They start in the main square and winds its way around the narrow streets and alleys of the city, until the party reaches La Alameda. All along the way there is cheerful music of the "Tambora" (consists of winds and percussion sounds) and a donkey laden with mezcal, so the entire crowd drinks this beverage in little jars called "jarritos".
- 5. From Earth to Sky The tour offers a visit to the legendary El Edén mine, where visitors can admire striking rock formations, mineral colors, and underground machinery, as well as the Museum of Rocks and Minerals, the largest of its kind in Latin America. On the way down from Cerro del Grillo take an exhilarating ride straight

over the heart of the city in a modern cable car.

- 6. A nightclub in a mine To get to the bar, you'll have to take a four-minute train ride through 600-foot-long underpass, the rattling train ride fulfills its promise of "another level" experience. At the disco, you'll be surprised by its acoustics and the pulsating lights of the carved dome.
- 7. Learn more about the MexicanTravel through time and become part of the General Villa's troop and learn about the battle of Toma de Zacatecas in 1914, through augmented reality and interactive multimedia. In addition, enjoy a tasting of mezcal, sweets and selection of local cheeses.
- 8. Legends and more legends Visit the gardens and old squares in a night tour while drinking mezcal and sample some typical sweets. Discover the famous buildings and landmarks that harbor mysteries, including a house where actors recreate stories of love, tragedy and terror. There is another option to learn about the legends in Zacatecas. You may join "el Diablito de Zacatecas" (the devil) an archetypal figure who shares spine-chilling stories as he interacts with the tour participants along the way.





9. Enjoy the Historic Centre of Zacatecas Be dazzled by beautiful Colonial Architecture, alleys with numerous legends, bars and restaurants full of tradition and much more. There are biking tours and Trolley Sightseeing – including night tours-, or you can walk on your own and explore the most beautiful corners of the Centre of Zacatecas.



10. Calderon Theater, tragedy, mystery and history; Stories based on real life historical events like the theater fire, the yellow fever outbreak, and some of the battles that took place in Zacatecas are played by phantasmagoric characters.

- 11. Explore the San Bernabé Mine This off-road ATV adventure offers intrepid travelers a ride through the dusty trails with nopal cactus, capricious rock formations, ponds and a dam. Then you can dig into one of the first major vein of silver in Zacatecas; access the mine through a tunnel of almost 330 feet-long and learn about the history of mining in the region.
- 12. Are you a beer lover? You can visit Cervecera Modelo, the world's second largest brewery, producing as many as 18.7 million beers a day and distributed 180 countries. Here you will enjoy the unmistakable aroma of the brewing process, the atmospheric enhancement of gleaming steel tanks, and of course the beer tasting.



13. If you love drinking wine. Whether by bike train or on foot, Vinícola Campo Real wine tours are an authentic wine country experience. Discover its unique production process and visit the Museo de la Barrica (Barrel Museum) with a unique display of barrels painted by famous Zacatecan artists. A great place to visit, especially at sunset, for a wine tasting experience you will never forget.





14. Converted bullring, now a luxury hotel One of the most singular hotels the world, built into the grandstand of San Pedro's beautifully restored 19th century bullring. Ingeniously preserving the character and beauty of the original structure. Learn about the legend of a passionate love story and why it is considered one of the most romantic places in town.

15. ATV is the best way to explore MuralTravel around a popular neighborhood with 30 colorful murals created by 40 urban artists of all ages and various countries.
