### 1. Summary

The GNOME.Asia Summit Vietnam 2009 focuses on the GNOME-desktop and applications eco-system. It brings together related free and open source software projects from Asia and around the world. More than 500 participants including software contributors, students, educational staff, government officials and enterprise business developers from 10 countries are expected to participate in the summit, which is the first international community event of its kind in Vietnam.

Following the successful GNOME.Asia Summit 2008 in Beijing, China, this years summit will take place from November 20-22, 2009 in Ho-Chi-Minh-City in the Quang Trung Software Park. The GNOME.Asia Summit provides a forum for users, developers, governments and businesses to discuss topics ranging from customization of desktops and small mobile devices, to enhancing user experience with open source or improving work flows in small and medium size enterprises. The event will explore the future of the free and open source community in Asia and offer insights into new ideas of the GNOME community that will make not just GNOME itself but any GTK+ based system including desktop environments like XFCE and LXDE even faster and easier to use.

Free and open source software projects already allow hundreds of millions of people to participate in the information society. Distributions like Ubuntu, Debian, Red Hat, Mandriva, OpenSolaris and many others distribute with GNOME and contribute to the desktop leading the free desktop market with virus resistant operating systems. During the three day summit there will be a variety of presentations and workshops and users will have opportunities to get involved in projects or adapt GNOME for their own use cases. Companies will have the chance to meet highly trained students and engage in matchmaking with local projects.
